

Make balls and set on wax paper.



Mary offered a song of praise to God when she found out she would have a baby. Using cotton swabs and black paint, make music notes (circles) on



Animal patterns


Animals welcomed Jesus when he was born. In each row, help the child find and circle a line of animals in the following pattern:





Can you help Jesus and his parents get home safely? Draw a way home with your finger or a crayon.




Read

They left their home in Nazareth to go to the temple in Jerusalem. They went to worship God and celebrate the Passover festival. Many people were traveling to Jerusalem.




When the celebration ended, Mary and Joseph started walking

Mary, Joseph, and Jesus went back home to Nazareth together.







middle. Place a rubber band around your scroll and give it to someone vou love.






Two or Many

Sing

When you see the the following poem or sing it to the tune of "Bingo." Optional: Beginning the second time through, replace the letter Jwith a clap. The next time, replace the letters J and E with a clap each. Continue until you clap five times instead of saying the letters.

Cook

Place a toy boat or small plastic container in the bathtub. along with toy fish and a small net from a bag of fruit. Talk about the Bible story during bath time. Using real water and props will create a lasting memory of the story.



Cut out the fish, boat, and Jesus pictures from the bottom of the page. Glue each picture in one of the empty boxes to make a pattern.








Who Is Kind and Loving?



They said to Jesus, "Don't come. The girl has died."


Jesus said to Jairus, "Do not be afraid. I will come with vou."

She stood right up and began to walk around!


Make a bouquet of prayers. Fill in the flowers with names of people your family is praying for. They could be family or friends or people in the news. Pray:

Make biscuits with jam!




2 cups / 240 g flour 1T/15g baking powder 1 tsp / 8 q salt



Make

... a backyard bird feeder!

You will need:

Pine cone or small cardboard tube String Vegetable shortening or butter Birdseed Plastic knife Tray or plate





What to do:

Tie the string around the pine cone or through the inside of the cardboard tube. Spread butter or shortening on the outside of the cardboard tube or pine cone. Spread birdseed on the tray or plate. Roll the pine cone or cardboard tube in birdseed. Hang your feeder outside and watch for birds!

Note: If using a cardboard tube, remove the feeder when the seed has been eaten to prevent mold from forming.





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
